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## NPDES Phase II Education and Public Outreach Minimum Measure Program 2008 Annual Report

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The Shingle Creek and West Mississippi Watershed Management Commissions conducted education and public outreach activities in 2008 in fulfillment of their joint NPDES Phase II Education and Public Outreach Plan. The Commissions' Education and Public Outreach Committee (EPOC) met monthly to implement the Plan. The Committee has no specific membership and is open to all interested parties. In addition, the EPOC meets jointly every 2-3 months with members of the Basset Creek WMO, Elm Creek WMO, and Three Rivers Park District staff as a Joint EPOC to coordinate education and outreach activities. The Pioneer-Sarah WMO will join the group in 2009.

The Shingle Creek and West Mississippi Watershed Management Organizations (WMOs) are members of the WaterShed Partners, a coalition of agencies, educational institutions, WMOs, Watershed Districts, and Soil and Water Conservation Districts that coordinate water resources education and public outreach planning in the Metro area. The WMOs are also members of BlueThumb, a consortium of agencies and vendors partnering to increase outreach and awareness.

In addition to a number of ongoing education and outreach activities, in 2008 the EPOC undertook two significant special activities.

### Opinion Survey Implementation

The first activity is implementing the results of the Joint Watershed Opinion Survey that was completed in late 2007. Results of the survey were disseminated to the participating cities and the media in 2008, and the Joint EPOC began using the results of the survey to refine the education and outreach campaign for 2009 and beyond.

The survey reveals that homeowners in these watersheds, especially long-time residents, have a surprisingly high knowledge of water resources issues. They are already undertaking some efforts to improve water quality, and expressed a willingness to do even more. They are also willing to pay for improved water quality, both individually and as a community obligation.

This level of sophistication about the issues speaks to the investment made at the local and state and regional levels to raise awareness about water resources and environmental issues. Respondents who self described themselves as “well informed” or “somewhat informed” about environmental issues were more likely to be willing to undertake new or expanded activities or support community activities.

What respondents say they lack is specific knowledge of what they should do and how to do it. The Joint EPOC is now developing a three year plan to provide: 1) general education to raise general awareness; 2) targeted information for special populations or for persons desiring a higher level of knowledge; and 3) special campaigns, including an informational campaign focused around “5 Easy Things You Can Do,” spearheading a Northwestern Metro Watersheds Summit, and a city staff volume management summit.

### Patrick Henry High School Summer Program

The EPOC worked with Patrick Henry High School in Minneapolis to provide programming for the schools three-week summer program in water quality. Commission staff, Three Rivers Park District, and Hennepin County Environmental Services staff partnered to provide a hands-on learning experience for about 30 high school students who learned about the effects of urbanization on water quality and biotic integrity in Shingle Creek. The students performed several monitoring activities on the Creek. They also spent time at the North Mississippi Regional Park to learn about Mississippi River issues. The school is interested in replicating the program in 2009.

Activities for 2008 are detailed below; the BMP narratives are attached to this report.

The Shingle Creek and West Mississippi Watershed Commissions have an extensive public education and outreach program that includes, among other things, information on storm water impacts and pollution prevention opportunities. Education efforts range from distributing brochures and newsletters, to meeting with interested community groups, to outreach efforts such as the volunteer monitoring programs. The messages and materials provided by SCWM WMC focus on the sources and impacts of storm water discharges on local water bodies, and what the public can do to reduce storm water runoff.
